**ORANGE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS SELECTS
EDUCATION NETWORKS OF AMERICA
FOR 3-YEAR BASE CONNECTIVITY CONTRACT**

(Orlando, FL)-March 7, 2007- Orange County Public Schools (OCPS) selected Education Networks of America (ENA) for a three-year base contract, with two (1) year renewal options, to provide high-speed broadband Internet access for their schools that will help teachers teach and students learn.

Under the contract, all of OCPS' K-12 schools will receive a managed district-wide network solution from ENA.
